---

**Exam:** Employee responsible for vision exam fee if provincial health care is not available.

**Contribution Limit:** Mercury Plastics of Canada will contribute to a maximum of \$250.00 every 24 months towards one complete pair of prescription safety eyewear.

Any costs exceeding these amounts are the responsibility of the employee and are to be collected by the Doctor's office at the time of dispensing. An invoice will accompany the final eyewear sent to the optometric clinic.

**Optical Lab:** Any contracted lab approved by the Alberta Association of Optometrists.

**Safety Frames:** Any CSA (Z94.3) or ANSI (Z87.1) compliant safety frame on the program.

*Side Shield* Fixed side shields are required.

**Lens Material:**

Glass **NOT ALLOWED.** (Glass lenses do not meet CSA standards)

Approved Materials  Plastic  Polycarbonate  Trivex

If material is not checked above, the material is restricted from use.

Computer Lenses Digitime lenses are allowed on program with management approval.

**Lens Treatments:**

Scratch Resistant Coating ALWAYS applied to lenses.

Ultra Violet Coating Allowed.

Anti-Reflective Coating Anti Reflective Coating – Allowed.  
(Anti-reflective is not available on CR39 plastic lens as per CSA requirements)

Tints Not allowed.

Photochromatics Not allowed.  
(Photochromatics is not available on Trivex lenses as per CSA requirements)
